Kamryn Kubose is an Associate at the California Product Stewardship Council. She is developing a new nonprofit, Central Valley Young Environmental Advocates, to provide educational and networking opportunities, and prepare the next generation of environmental leaders.

Kieshaun White, at age 21, is a veteran environmental advocate. He started monitoring Fresno air quality 7 years ago. He learned there was a 25-year difference in the life expectancy between Fresno residents who live in the northern part of the city compared to those in his southwest neighborhood.



Destiny Rodriguez is Community Relations Manager with The Climate Center. She worked on environmental issues in the Central Valley for fifteen years, with the Coalition for Clean Air, National Parks Conservation Association, and the San Joaquin River Parkway and Conservation Trust.

Mona Cummings is CEO of Tree Fresno, transforming the Central Valley with more trees and green space. She was a team leader for the AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps and as Africa Regional Director for Tererai Trent International, creating educational opportunities for girls.



Feng Teter is a student leader at Fresno State, a member of the Sustainability Club, and the former President of the Geology Club. She is engaged in sustainability tracking and reporting for the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education.
